The fourth weekend of each July, the church I pastor holds an annual meeting. A Primitive Baptist annual meeting is a series of worship services held Friday through Sunday typically preached by a guest minister. Other denominations hold similar meetings and call them revivals. Last week we held our annual meeting, and I would like to share a few particulars concerning Saturday night's service.

The day was hot and humid, 100 degrees. We had dinner in our dining hall, promptly at 6:00. We cleaned our dishes and put away the food, promptly at 6:50. We

entered the meeting house and began singing, promptly at 7:00. But at 7:10, we lost power. That evening, the demand on the power company by the community was too great and we lost electricity.

Knowing that the temperatures would rapidly increase and light would fade; we ended the song service, omitted introductory comments, said a short prayer, and asked the preacher to begin. Soon, the deacons began opening windows and passing out fans (paper plates). The preacher preached and was sweating buckets. But then, a miracle happened. God showed up. From a natural standpoint, a lot of things went wrong; but God showed up – and only ten minutes of singing.

Ask any of our members as to the meeting's highlight and 99% will tell you about Saturday night's message. What's the lesson? Compare how much time we spend preparing for natural things with the time we spend begging for God's presence. We know what's important, but we fret most over that with very little importance. Amen?

Later in the evening, back at my house, the guest preacher said that for a moment he wasn't too sure how the meeting would go. I told him that I never doubted; that I was confident it would be a great service. He asked, "What made you so sure?" I told him, "The best sermons never get recorded." Miracles can be that way (Matt 11:5).

In The Beginning (Series cont'd.)

"In the beginning God created the heaven and the earth" – Genesis 1:1

It is possible for one to be a creationist concerning nature, but an evolutionist when it comes to spiritual things. It is by faith that we see God as the sovereign creator of both worlds: the *natural* and the *spiritual*.

When God created man, He did not ask man's opinion. Adam was passive when God formed him from the dust of the earth and breathed the breath of life into his nostrils. God needed no assistance. All of nature was passive. The birds, the fish, the earth, there was none of it. God spake and it was done. But what about regeneration, the new birth, when one of Adam's race made of clay, is born of God's spirit? Does this evolve over a process of time? Does man assist God in this miraculous change? Is it procured by a series of religious exercises? What does God say about it?

By faith we believe God's sovereign declaration of this creative fiat as well: "Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new" – 2 Corinthians 5:17. The Bible is very clear on this issue. Any person in Christ has become a "new creature". The word "creature" means creation: he has been *created* anew. Man does not evolve from an old creature to a new creature. He is *passive* in the change. God, and God alone, brings it about. No wonder there are so many conflicting ideas as to how this occurs. A solemn belief in God as the sovereign Creator will silence all arguments.



When a person becomes a new creature, things *change*: "all things are become new". This new creature has Spiritual appetites that he never had before. As the spirit of God moved upon the face of the waters and brought beauty out of chaos in His natural creation (Gen. 1:2), so moves God's spirit upon the heart of unregenerate man and brings beauty by His spiritual creation. This beauty is apparent as there is a notable change in the life (Acts 9:6). He now hungers and thirsts for righteousness (Mat. 5:6). He is interested in the Bible. The gospel comes to him in power and not in word only (I Thes 1:4,5). He now hates the things he once loved and loves the things he once hated (Ephesians 2:3-5). There is now the knowledge of sin (Romans 7:24). God's law is written in the heart (Hebrews 8:10-11). The name of Jesus is sweet in his ears (John 11:28-29). He looks for a city which hath foundations, whose builder and maker is God (Hebrews 11:9-10).

This is a miraculous change indeed, and it occurs sovereignly, when God ordains it. As with John the Baptist, it may be in the mother's womb, or as Saul of Tarsus, it may be upon the Damascus Road. It is truly life from death and only God can make that change, "And you hath **he** (emphasis mine) quickened, who were dead in trespasses and sins" – Ephesians 2:1. "**He**" is not the preacher or the message; it is GOD the Creator! The gospel will not give life, but rather, sheds light upon the life that God has already imparted (II Timothy 1:10). God reaches the heart and prepares the heart by this change to receive the message of Jesus Christ. Belief in this message does not bring about the change, but is rather an evidence of the change that God has already brought about. There may be those who claim this change with no real evidence manifested in the life; no spiritual breathings; no spiritual fruits upon the tree; no real change; no new creation. Man may have claimed the creation when God has had no part in it.

Let us not allow man to usurp the power of God and claim a portion of His creation. After all, "Hath not the potter power over the clay, of the same lump to make one vessel unto honour, and another unto dishonour?" – Romans 9:21. Where do you stand? Do you believe that God is the sovereign creator of all worlds...even yours?

Revival at Zion PBC

Zion Primitive Baptist Church was established near Gordo, Alabama, in 1847. It was a rock in the Zion Community for many years and was evangelistic in helping establish several fellowships and at least one other church – Bethlehem, in 1901. The pastor of Bethlehem Primitive Baptist Church today is Elder Tim McCool. During the 1920s, Zion Primitive Baptist Church fell into the destructive error of absolutism, also known as the false doctrine of the absolute predestination of all things. Under the influence of this false teaching, the church dwindled to 5 members by the year 2000, and was all but a forgotten memory of encouragement and influence in the surrounding area. Around 2001, Elder Tim McCool, also an

> attorney, helped to advise the dwindling church at Zion on certain legal matters. It was at that time that Elder McCool was first burdened by the Lord that a revival could possibly take place there.

> But this did not happen until 10 years later and only one living church member survived. The last living member - Sis. Lorene Deason - opened the doors of the church to hold services twice a month on Sunday nights

in June, 2011. The initial service and those thereafter were packed and the preaching was blessed of the Lord. On the first Sunday in August, 2011, the church held a conference that was attended by members and preachers from Five Mile, Tuscaloosa, Hopewell, Vestavia, Zion Rest, Bethlehem Primitive Baptist Churches, and others. At this conference, held before a full church house, Zion Church severed ties with the false doctrine of absolutism and churches condoning such, reaffirmed the original articles of faith, and requested to reestablish fellowship with regular, Old-line churches that it once fellowshipped with. As an added blessing, the church received one new member that very night!

The Sunday night meetings continued, with Elder McCool continuing to preside over the services. On the first Sunday afternoon in October, Bethlehem Primitive Baptist Church held its regular communion service to conclude the anniversary meeting of that weekend. During that communion service, members of Zion Primitive Baptist Church and members of Bethlehem communed together for the first time in almost 100 years. That very night at Zion Church, after a powerful sermon preached by Elder Sam Bryant, the church at Zion was blessed by the Lord to experience more revival. At the close of the service, Elder McCool's brother, Chris McCool, came forward requesting membership at Zion. Bro. Chris McCool, a truth believer for all of his life, was already an ordained Independent Baptist preacher. It was as if the Lord was giving His stamp of approval for the church's turning from false doctrine, in sending them a wonderful gift in Bro. Chris on the very night of communing again with fellow truth believers.

Following Bro. Chris' baptism, the church has now tripled its membership in three months, which very well could be a record for an Old Baptist Church! On the first Sunday night in November, the church voted to liberate Bro. Chris to exercise his gift. The church also voted to meet each Sunday at 5 p.m., in order to have a weekly worship service in the community.

Zion Primitive Baptist Church would like to request ongoing prayer that the Lord would continue to bless, and for continued spiritual growth. The church would also like to request prayer in the eventual selection of a pastor. It is also the desire of the church to encourage other dwindling churches to cling to the faith once delivered to the saints, and pray that the merciful God of heaven will open up a similar door for revival. Zion Church invites all to come and worship on Sunday nights at 5 p.m. The church is located 8 miles north of Gordo, on Hwy 159 North, turn left onto County Road 49, and the church is on the right. I am looking past my circumstances, to heaven's throne above.


My prayers have reached the heart of God. I am resting in His love.

Macedonia PBC, Delark, AR


Macedonia PBC near Arkadelphia recently received two new members, Brother Jesse Rich
