Traits of A Sheep

Ever wonder why God so often refers to saints as sheep? Let us consider their traits. Sheep are/have:

- Easily lost, unable to find their way home
- Excellent voice and face recognition
- Easily incapacitated; wet and upside down, sheep become stuck like turtles.
- ◆ Heft (settle) and must be forced to rotate pastures
- ◆ Closely related to goats: beards, upturned tails, and divided upper lips distinguish
- Defenselessness: depend upon guard donkeys, dogs, and shepherds for protection

- Rebellious, submission is taught with a broken leg
- Vulnerable when eating: four stomach compartments minimize the lowering of heads
- Easily scared, will not lie down until they feel safe
- Shepherd sits among sheep to calm them
- ◆ Lying down is important to digestion
- ◆ If one sheep bullies another, all become upset and food isn't digested
- Cannot differentiate between good and bad water, or poisonous and nonpoisonous vegetation
- Will drink only quiet, still water, but dew can be a sufficient source if they eat early enough
- Cuts, scrapes, and bug bites must be anointed daily

Knowledge and the Church

Article #19 from Elder Neil M. Phelan, Jr.'s Book "The Daily Record" – The First Year in Retrospect-Published 01/08/99

"And moreover, because the preacher was wise, he still taught the people knowledge; yea, he gave good heed, and sought out, and set in order many proverbs" – **Eccles.** 12:9

Ecclesiastes, the book from which our passage is found, means "one who calls people out; a gatherer of the people". The purpose of the calling out, or gathering together, was to impart knowledge. Godly knowledge. This is a church scene. That is why Solomon refers to himself as "the preacher". He taught the people knowledge.

The whole book of Ecclesiastes is a sermon. Solomon's God given job was not to give his opinion, nor was it to tell people what they wanted to hear by tickling their ears (II Tim. 4:3). His job was not to devise programs and schemes to pack the house for the sake of money and numbers, nor was it to schedule entertainments to tickle their fancy. His job was the same as the preachers of 1999. Tell the people what God had revealed to him. Give them Godly knowledge and in doing so the people would prosper in the good hand of their Lord.

Knowledge has always been the lifeblood of the church. It always has been and it always will be. A church with a zeal for biblical knowledge, willing to conform to its teaching,

> light will shine brightly in a dark world as opposed to becoming like the world. The book of Acts begins with such a people. It was Peter who stood up on the day of Pentecost and said, "But this is that which was spoken by the prophet Joel" (Acts 2:16). Peter had his nose in the book. He had

been studying the

scriptures. It was

is a church whose

by the knowledge he had gained that he was able to stand up on that day and declare what was happening to them on that occasion. About three thousand souls were baptized on that day. Oh, how important knowledge is!

The desire for biblical knowledge is an evidence of grace, a token of divine favor. It is one of the first signs of spiritual life. Life, then hunger; that is the order. Saul of Tarsus was quite proud of his worldly accomplishments and his position among his peers. But after his experience with Jesus on the Damascus Road his desires changed. He had a hunger for something different. "I count all things but loss for the excellency of the knowledge of Christ Jesus my Lord" - Philipp. 3:8a. Saul would say, "Tell me more about Jesus, about the power of his resurrection, about the fellowship of his sufferings" (Philipp. 3:10). He was hungry for knowledge. I am persuaded this has been the experience of God's people throughout the ages. When I meet a person who wants to know more about Jesus, I know I have met a brother or a sister in Christ.

There is a mystical union between knowledge and the soul. When a baby is born, it craves the milk of its mother. When one is born from above, they crave the "sincere milk of the word" which is food to the hungry soul. The Lord has made His people in such a way, to crave knowledge from above. This is for their own health. It is by the nutrition of such food, biblical knowledge, the soul grows and prospers. A sickly soul, a diseased soul, is one in which there is a lack of this kind of knowledge. We observe many such souls in our society today. Healthy souls are hungry souls fed with manna from on high: biblical knowledge.

Before we close we must give you four stumbling blocks to Godly knowledge: (1) **Fear**. When we are faced with a biblical truth that we have never heard before, we are quick to run. We all have our comfort zone. But we must remember: it is Godly knowledge that we are led only closer to the fount of every blessing. There is a difference between talking about the Bible and learning from the Bible. Let us be noble like the Bereans, who "received the word with all readiness of mind, and searched the scriptures daily, whether those things were so"

-Acts 17:11. If it is in the book we must believe it. (2) **Sloth**. The study of God's word was once the joy of every Christian. Have you sharpened your sword today? (3) **The wrong kind of knowledge**. James writes of a knowledge that descendeth not from above, but in earthly, sensual, devilish (James 3:15). Some knowledge is dangerous to the soul. (4) **Ignorance**. While Peter wrote of those who were "willingly ignorant", they did not want to know (II Peter 3:5), Paul wrote of those who had a zeal, but not according to knowledge (Romans 10:1-4). Both are equally dangerous.

Yes, Solomon was wise, he taught the people knowledge. Lord, teach us knowledge that we may teach others.

Report from Mexico

We were blessed to begin holding worship services in Juarez, Mexico in June of 2006. After a regular routine of Wednesday and Sunday services for seven months, there were several who desired baptism. Since my membership was still with Providence Primitive Baptist Church in Davao, Philippines, the names of the newly baptized members were first connected with that church under the pastoral leadership of Elder Gus Harter. The Church there granted our letters to constitute the brothers and sisters into the Shekinah Primitive Baptist Church (Iglesia Bautista Primitiva) in January of 2007.

Some time later Brother Jose Luna Sanchez and his wife, Tina Sanchez, and their two children, Sarai and Francisco, began attending services. After the initial acquaintance, Brother Jose Luna began coming to our house every day for prayer and bible teaching. We first studied through the Articles of Faith, after which I prepared an exam over this material and he satisfactorily completed the questions.

Brother Jose Luna continued with this pattern from February – April of 2011, at which time he presented himself for baptism and was received as a member of Shekinah Iglesia Bautista Primitiva (Shekinah Primitive Baptist Church).

His interest for bible study grew stronger and he continued coming to the house each day to pray and work through more lessons, and exams over each of the sets. In June it was evident to me that he demonstrated a desire to speak publicly before the church. He began with 10 -20 minute messages which continued through July. Following this, he began to speak and present lessons for the complete worship service. He displayed a quality of respect and attention from the congregation and they were blessed by his messages. This arrangement has continued until the present, March, 2012. His diligence to read, study and work through the lessons and exams is still our present arrangement. As his pastor I am satisfied that he does have a call on his life to preach the gospel, and I have set him aside as a licensed speaker before the church to officially exercise the gift of preaching the gospel.

Since this is a work in Mexico, and the opportunity for other preachers to observe and become acquainted with Brother Jose Luna Sanchez, is difficult, I have prepared this short description of his church history.

It this present pattern continues, at some future date, I will recommend him to the church as a candidate for Ordination as an Ordained Gospel Minister. Then I would recommend to the church to call several ordained Primitive Baptist Elders to come and form a presbytery for his ordination. He is outgoing in the community to invite families to church, pray for their needs and read the bible with them. With his wife, they prepare and feed 80 children each week, as well as a special meal each week for several elderly men from the community.
