Lay Hold on Eternal Life - by Elder Dolph Painter

What does it mean to "lay hold on eternal life?" Was Paul telling Timothy eternal life is yours for the taking, so grab hold?

"Fight the good fight of faith, lay hold on eternal life, whereunto thou art also called, and hast professed a good profession before many witnesses." (1Timothy 6:12)

"Laying up in store for themselves a good foundation against the time to come, that they may lay hold on eternal life." (1 Timothy 6:19)

No, Paul was telling Timothy to embrace eternal life to the extent

that it altered Timothy's thinking and behavior. Paul wanted Timothy's walk and ministry to reflect the eternal life that awaited Timothy.

Consider the following: For I reckon that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us (Romans 8:18). Paul said: based on my calculations, the bumps in the road on earth are nothing compared [to] that which awaits me in heaven. And a person who thinks in this manner is a person who talks and walks differently. A person with a confident expectation in heaven is a person who has laid hold on eternal life (Romans 8:19-23).

Does the promise of eternal life affect your thinking? Does it alter your behavior? It should. Lay hold on eternal life and it will change the way you think and act. You will notice it, others will notice it, and God will be praised.

"I Believe in Angels" - Part 1 - By Elder Neil Phelan, Jr.

"For the Sadducees say that there is no resurrection, neither angel, nor spirit: but the Pharisees confess both"

- Acts 23:8

Do you believe in angels? If you do, I want to tell you that you are in good company. The apostle Paul, a Pharisee, divided the council of Pharisees and Sadducees over the question of angels and the resurrection. Knowing that the Sadducees did not believe in either. Paul reasoned and said: "For the Sadducees say that there is no resurrection, neither angel, nor spirit: but the Pharisees confess both" - Acts 23:8. Paul confessed both: the resurrection and angels. I don't believe in U.F.O.s, life on other planets, cities at the bottom of the sea, in reincarnation, or evolution. But I do believe in angels.

The Bible gives us insight into at least three types of angels: The Cherubim; the Seraphim; and the unnamed variety referred to simply as 'angel.' Consider the splendor of the scene as the 'angel' spoke to the shepherds and said, "Fear not: for, behold I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people," and as the message was heralded concerning the birth of the Christ child, "suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God, and saying, Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will toward men" -Luke 2:10,13,14. Here we find a multitude of angels.

The Cherubim is an angel of great power and is observed in scripture as a protector, a defense, a covering or a guard to an opening. This creature is mentioned over forty times

in scripture. We first find the Cherubim guarding the way to the tree of life after Adam's sin, "So he drove out the man; and he placed at the east of the garden of Eden Cherubim, and a flaming sword which turned every way, to keep the way of the tree of life" – Genesis 3:24. The Cherubim must be a winged creature because Ezekiel noted that "the sound of the cherubims' wings was heard even to the outer court, as the voice of the Almighty God when he speaketh" – Ezekiel 10:5.

Isaiah was blessed of God to behold 'seraphims.' This creature was most awesome, possessing six wings. Isaiah saw the seraphims above the throne of God: "Above it stood the seraphims: each one had six wings; with twain he covered his face, and with twain he covered his feet, and with twain he did fly." – Isaiah 6:2.

The accounts of unspecified angels are numerous and common in scripture, both in the Old and New Testament. Some of them either possessed, or took on, human form as we find the angels that visited Abraham in the plains of Mamre before the destruction of Sodom and Gomorrah (Genesis 19). The definition of 'messenger' fits their title as we observe them faithfully carrying out their orders from the most High, imparting some spiritual message to unsuspecting mortals.

It seems, by scriptural language, that angels do not procreate any more than the resurrected bodies of the saints. "For when they shall rise from the dead, they neither marry, nor are given in marriage; but are as the angels which are in heaven" - Mark 12:25. Therefore there were a specific number of angels created of God. While the Bible does not tell us how many angels there are, we know that there are at least 72,000 angels for Jesus said, "thinkest thou that I cannot now pray to my Father, and he shall presently give me more than twelve legions of angels?" – Matthew 26:53. In that day, one legion of soldiers contained 6,000 men: 12x6,000 = 72,000.

The power of an angel is awesome. In the days of Hezekiah, one angel of the Lord went out, and "smote in the camp of the Assyrians an hundred fourscore and five thousand: and when they arose early in the morning, behold, they were all dead corpses" – Il Kings 19:35. One angel destroyed 185,000 of the Lord's enemies in one night. (Continued on page 4)

Biographical Sketch - Elder H.P. Copeland

From an Obituary in the December 1964 "Primitive Monitor," written by Elder Edgar T. Aleshire

Elder Haden Paul Copeland was born February 23, 1906, at Summit in Blount County, Alabama, the son of Virgil H. and Bell Murry Copeland. He was married to Jimmie Alice Bodine October 25, 1925. He was baptized at Rocky Mount Church, Arab, Alabama, in 1932 by Elder Tom Flanning, was ordained to the full work of the gospel ministry in 1934, and was called to Rocky Mount Church at that time as pastor. He was the beloved pastor of Rocky Mount, Bush Hill (of Birmingham, AL), New Hope and Salem Churches at the time of his death, and had traveled often among the Primitive Baptists in twenty-four states. He was a mail carrier in the Arab community for eighteen years, had taught school in his earlier years, and

had farmed throughout most of his life. For some years he preached over radio stations WGSV in Guntersville and WVOK in Birmingham. Elder Copeland was well known in his own community and among the Lord's people as being a minister who was unusually gifted in delivery and who was also very frequently called upon to conduct funerals, often as many as five in one week, for people of all religious persuasion.

Elder and Sister Copeland were killed on a rain-slick highway in Cullman County, Alabama, September 18, 1964. Over two thousand people attended their double funeral held September 20, 1964, at Rocky Mount Church, [which was conducted by Elders C.M. Mills, A.B. Hall, W.O. Hunt, Jr., J.B. Watts, and Lasserre Bradley, Jr.]. One of the many who wrote the Monitor office concerning Elder and Sister Copeland's deaths spoke of the fact that in his last discourse, preached within hours of his death, Elder Copeland used the words from Il Corinthians, "Finally, brethren, farewell."

Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

On Sunday night, Brother James and Sister Ilene Waddle met with us to worship at Zion Church (Zion, AL). They are members of Sulphur Springs Church near Caledonia, MS. They asked Zion Church to pray for their 11 month old grandson, Landon Waddle. He had been diagnosed with glaucoma and the pressure in his eyes was dangerously high. The doctor had said that without surgery he would go blind. Yesterday, the doctor looked at his eyes again and discovered that the pressure was normal and there was no sign of glaucoma. The doctor then asked the family if they had any questions, to which they replied, "We're so shocked, we don't know what to ask."

Sister Waddle told me the verse that was upon her mind throughout this ordeal was Nahum 1:7, "The Lord is good, a strong hold in the day of trouble; and he knoweth them that trust in him."

Sister Waddle's purpose in calling me today was to ask me to let the church know about God's miracle. We often ask the church to pray for those who are sick. However, we often neglect to ask the church to join with us in praising God for healing our loved ones. Jesus once said, after healing ten lepers "... Were there not ten cleansed? but where are the nine?" (Luke 17:17). Leprosy is an infectious disease that causes severe, disfiguring skin sores and nerve damage in the arms and legs. In Bible times, lepers were segregated from the general population and shunned as outcasts.

In America, we have easy access to the best medical care in the world. A couple of days ago, I went to a "walk-in clinic" to seek treatment for a severe sinus infection. In less than an hour, without an appointment, I was diagnosed by a medical doctor, given shots with steroids and an antibiotics, and an antibiotic prescription was called in to the pharmacy, which I picked up on my way back to the office. It was only a slight inconvenience for me to receive the care I needed.

Oftentimes, we are as unthankful today as the lepers were whom Jesus healed. May we be like the one grateful leper of whom it was said, "And one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, and with a loud voice glorified God, and fell down on his face at his feet, giving him thanks: and he was a Samaritan. And Jesus answering said, where there not ten cleansed? but where are the nine? There are not found that returned to give glory to God, save this stranger. (Luke 17:15-18). It is significant that Jesus stated, "and he was a Samaritan." The Samaritans were hated by the Jews because they were "half breeds." Even Jesus referred the healed man as a "stranger." However, Jesus praised the man's gratitude. God is still "no respecter of persons: but in every nation he that feareth him and worketh righteousness is accepted with him."

Are you among the 90% who do not give thanks to God, or the 10% who do?
